The Resident Doctors Association of Zambia (RDAZ) proudly hosted its Annual Scientific Conference and Annual General Meeting on April 5th and 6th, 2024, in Kitwe under the theme, Innovative and Solutions: Shaping the future of healthcare in Zambia.

The event was attended by more than 250 medical professionals across the country. It provided a platform for sharing knowledge and discussing innovations in the healthcare sector. Several insightful presentations were made by the Zambia Public health Institute (ZNPHI), ECHO team from the Ministry of Health, The Health Professions Council of Zambia (HPCZ), IHM - Smart Care, JSH, ICAP at Columbia University in Zambia, not forgetting the seven research papers presented.

A highlight of the conference was the attendance of the guest of honor, Honourable Sylvia T. Masebo MP, whose keynote address offered invaluable insights into the government's commitment to pioneering healthcare solutions. Her presence underscored the significance of the event, lending both inspiration and credibility, and motivating attendees to strive for excellence in healthcare delivery.

The Annual General Meeting on the last day saw the adoption of the first ever RDAZ Council By-laws, the selection of the new electoral commissions to oversee the 2025 national executive elections and the Presentation of the first ever RDAZ externally audited financial reports.

RDAZ'S COMMITMENT TO COMBATING CHOLERA: Visits to Chainda and Lusaka Heroes Stadium Treatment Centres.

In January 2024, the Resident Doctors Association of Zambia (RDAZ) undertook visits to two key cholera treatment centres: The Chainda Health Centre and the Lusaka Heroes Stadium Cholera Treatment Centre. These visits were aimed at assessing needs, providing support, and reinforcing the fight against the cholera epidemic in Zambia.

Visit to Chainda Health Centre: The RDAZ leadership visited Chainda Health Centre with the primary goal of understanding the facility's requirements for effectively eliminating cholera in the community. During the visit, RDAZ representatives emphasized the crucial role of community involvement in combating cholera. They stressed the importance of educating the public on the causes, transmission, signs, and symptoms of cholera, as well as the necessity of immediate and effective rehydration at the community level.

Key discussions with local leaders included the need to address alcohol consumption, as highlighted by Ward Councillor Mr. Nsama Mpundu who noted that many cholera cases were concentrated around areas with high alcohol consumption and urged the community to adhere to health tips provided by various stakeholders on preventing the disease.

Visit to Lusaka Heroes Stadium Cholera Treatment Centre: The team also visited the Lusaka Heroes Stadium Cholera Treatment Centre to show support to resident doctors working on the frontlines and to donate essential items to help combat the ongoing epidemic. This visit was also an opportunity to demonstrate the Associations unwavering commitment to supplementing on Government efforts in fighting against Cholera.

RDAZ reassured the Minister of Health, Honourable Sylvia Masebo, of their continued dedication to supporting Government's initiatives. The Association further advocated for the employment of more doctors to ensure adequate and accessible health services for all Zambians.



A NIGHT TO REMEMBER: THE SHALINA - RESIDENT DOCTORS ASSOCIATION OF ZAMBIA RISING STAR PROGRAM GRAND FINALE

The Shalina-Resident Doctors Association of Zambia Rising Star Program Grand Finale a spectacular event held on the 23rd of March 2024 at Taj Pamodzi Hotel. The program provided a unique platform for resident doctors to showcase their clinical talents and sharpen their clinical skills. It was also, promoting research among young doctors in the profession.

It comprised of three eventful stages from the submission of clinical case reports from two institutions namely the University Teaching Hospital and Levy Mwanawasa University Teaching Hospital to evaluating of these reports by expert evaluators then the selection of best ten reports which were then presented at the grand finale.

The event was graced by the Minister of Health, Honourable Sylvia T Masebo MP as the guest of honour, Professor Victor Chalwe the Acting Director, National Health Research Authority. Team of four evaluators led by Dr Jonathan Sitali, the Registrar -Zambia College of Medicine and Surgery and country director of Shalina Pharmaceuticals Ltd, Mr Umesh Giri.

The competition was fierce, but in the end, three shining stars emerged as the winners. Taking home the coveted first prize was Dr. Wesley Banda a registrar in ophthalmology at the University Teaching Hospital, whose presentation was on Congenital Bilateral Clinical Retinoblastoma. Dr. Stanley Mwila, a final year registrar in urology at LMUTH scoped the second prize with a presentation on penile reconstruction following a near total amputation from a dog bite in a 5month old baby. The third prize went Dr. Evelyn Kaumba a registrar under Ear, Nose and Throat Department at LMUTH who presented on Squamous Cell Carcinoma of the Larynx. The Prizes amounted to K15,000, K10,000 and K5,000 respectively.
