# RDAZ Calls for Action on Medical Supply Chain Challenges

"Access to essential medicines is a cornerstone of any functional health system." – Dr. Paul Chibwe, RDAZ President

On 16th May 2025, the Resident Doctors Association of Zambia (RDAZ) expressed deep concern over the suspension of U.S. health sector aid linked to irregularities in Zambia's medical supply chain. As frontline providers, RDAZ noted that disruptions in access to essential medicines threaten service delivery and public health.

While commending ongoing efforts by the Ministry of Health to strengthen procurement systems, RDAZ stressed the urgent need for transparency, accountability, and ethical leadership in managing medical supplies.

### RDAZ's 5 Key Recommendations

Multi-Stakeholder Oversight – Civil society, health bodies & partners to monitor the supply chain.

Ethical Leadership – Asset declarations & lifestyle audits for procurement officials.

Equal Justice – Misconduct cases investigated fairly, regardless of rank.

Digital Supply Chain – Real-time tracking & improved transparency.

Whistleblower Protection – Stronger safeguards to report malpractice safely.

RDAZ reaffirmed its commitment to working with government and partners to safeguard public health. "By acting collectively, we can rebuild trust, improve service delivery, and ensure equitable access to medicines for all Zambians," said Dr. Chibwe.



## **Empowering Oral Health in Zambia**

The Resident Doctors Association of Zambia (RDAZ), under the leadership of President Dr. Paul Chibwe and Secretary General Dr. Lucky Mulelemba, proudly joined the Zambia Dental Association in collaboration with the Copperbelt Provincial Health Office for a clinical symposium in Ndola.

Held under the inspiring theme "Oral Health Revolution: Innovations, Insights, and Interdisciplinary Care," the event brought together Dental Surgeons and Dental Therapists from across the northern region to deliberate on innovations, challenges, and opportunities in oral healthcare.

The symposium was honored by the presence of distinguished guests, including:

Key discussions centered on strengthening capacity building to tackle the growing oral health burden in communities. Participants emphasized the importance of innovation and interdisciplinary collaboration in advancing oral healthcare services in Zambia.

The Zambia Dental Association and the Provincial Health Director commended RDAZ for its active participation and acknowledged the Association as a crucial stakeholder in the ongoing advocacy for a stronger, more inclusive healthcare system.









## **RDAZ Luapula Branch Leads with Fundraising Gala**

On 30th August 2025, the RDAZ Luapula Branch hosted a fundraising gala to renovate the dilapidated call rooms at Mansa General Hospital, the main referral center for all 15 constituencies in the province. For years, doctors there have endured unsafe conditions that compromise both welfare and emergency response.

RDAZ President Dr. Paul Chibwe and Vice President Dr. Collins Simbeye stressed that dignified, functional call rooms are essential—not luxuries—and urged other branches to emulate Luapula's initiative.

The event drew strong support: the Provincial Minister (via DPS Sikabuba) pledged government action; Hon. Dr. Chitalu Chilufya committed K100,000 and parliamentary backing; and the Mayor promised to mobilize further local resources. Corporate partner Xtenda Finance Limited was also recognized for its contribution.

The NEC commended Luapula's proactive stance, affirming that this effort signals a broader call: investing in doctors' welfare is investing in Zambia's healthcare system and future.
